SPARE PARTS SELLER



AUTOMOTIVE SECTOR STUDY PATHS

- **1 Vocational Training:** Each year, upper secondary vocational schools offer nearly 2,500 starting places for automotive studies, and approximately 600 students earn their vocation and specialised vocational qualifications. In addition to this, graduates with a vocational qualification in business and administration also work in customer service and sales.
- **Apprenticeship:** An apprenticeship is based on a fixed-term employment agreement between an employer and the student, who receives training in the field as part of the job. The student's personal study plan is linked to the apprenticeship.
- **University of Applied Sciences:** Engineering (Bachelor's) degree programmes are divided into product technology, automotive electrical systems, after-sales marketing and logistics studies. In addition, Bachelors of Business Administration (BBA) can find employment in the automotive sector in business positions, such as marketing, sales and IT.

University: Automotive technology or its indirectly related mechanical engineering can be studied at several universities of technology. Many other academic fields are also represented in the automotive sector, such as economics, law, administrative sciences and communications.
